OVERALL ARIZONA NICS IMPROVEMENT ACT PURPOSE STATEMENT

On January 8, 2011, a horrific act of violence committed in Tucson left six people dead and 14 injured, including former United States Representatives Gabrielle Giffords and Ron Barber. The shooter suffering from mental health and substance abuse issues exhibited observable behaviors prior to the shooting. Arizona stakeholders, led by the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission (ACJC), had been working to address the issue of improving records submitted to the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS), and this horrific event was a catalyst for Arizona policy makers to dedicate additional attention to the improvement to mental health and criminal history information reporting to NICS.

In March 2013, the Arizona NICS Task Force published the Arizona NICS Act Reporting Improvement Plan with a total of 30 Recommendations. Since the release, nine additional recommendations were provided by the Commission and have been adopted by the Task Force. Progress continues on all NICS Categories, in regards to legislation and policy changes that will greatly enhance reporting to NICS. Legislation on Category 5 passed in both the Arizona House and Senate and HB2322 was signed into law by Governor Jan Brewer on April 30, 2014. SB1373 authorizing notification of a mental health determination to law enforcement was signed into law by Governor Doug Ducey on May 1, 2015. House Bill 2154, simplifying Failure to Appear statutes and clarifying fingerprinting protocols, was signed into law by Governor Ducey on April 5, 2016.
